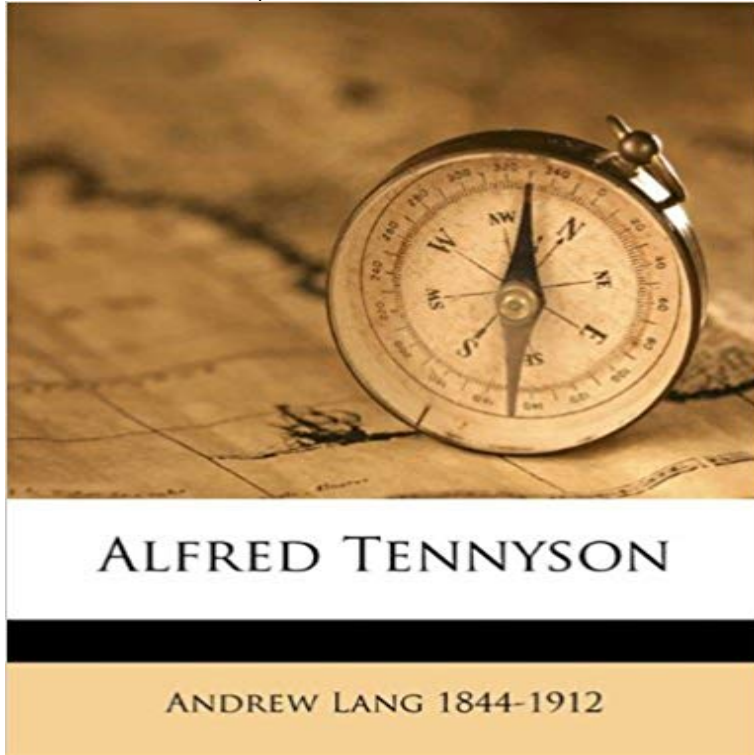


Alfred Tennyson
