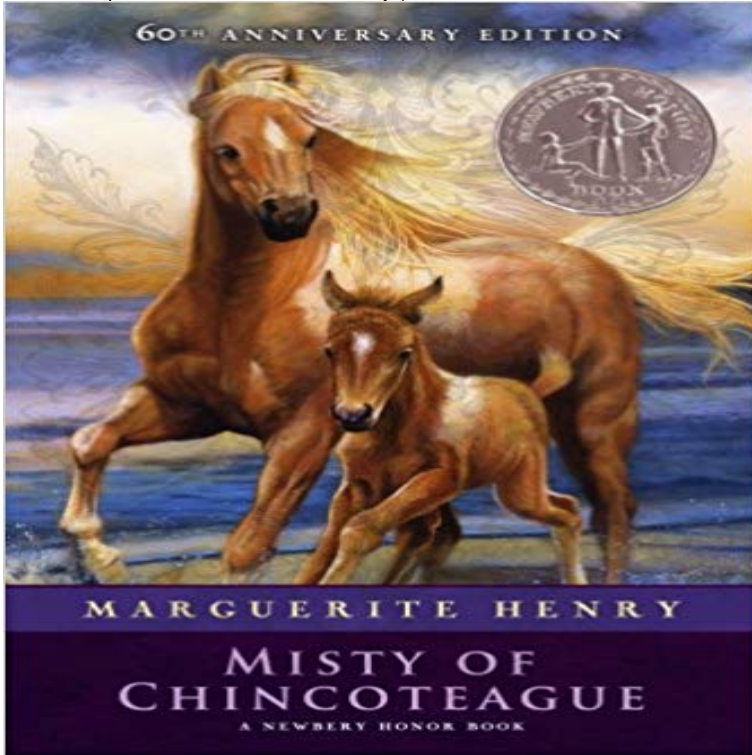


Misty of Chincoteague
