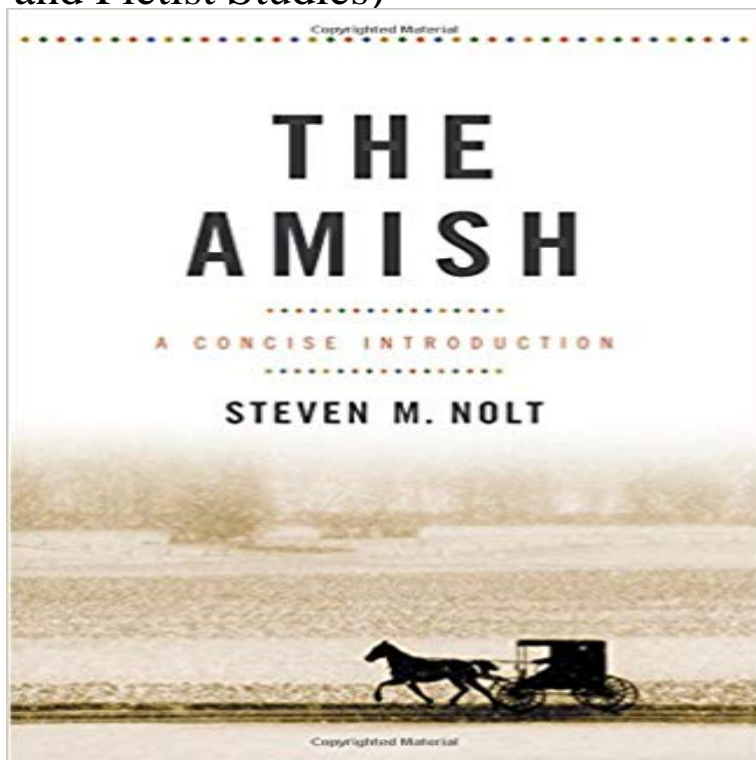


The Amish: A Concise Introduction (Young Center Books in Anabaptist and Pietist Studies)

He takes on much-hyped topics such as Rumspringa and reveals the distinctive Amish approach to technology. He also explains how Amish principles stand in contrast to contemporary American values, including rational efficiency, large-scale organization, and Western notions of individuality.
