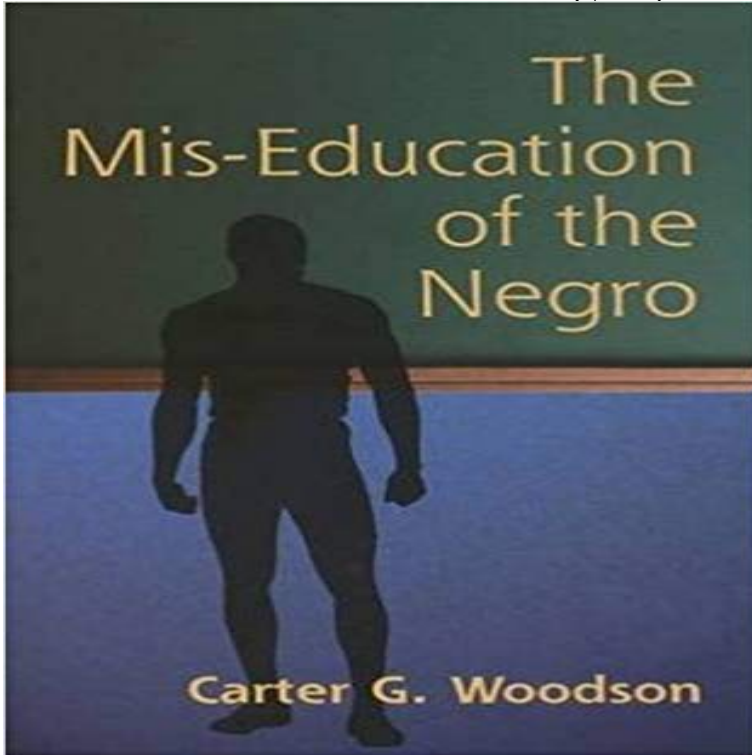


# The Mis-Education of the Negro (African American)



In 1933, American historian and educator Carter Woodson (1875-1950) delivered a powerful and prophetic denouncement of Euro-centric school curricula that still rings true. In issuing this challenge, Woodson laid the foundation for more progressive and egalitarian educational institutions.
